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1.0 INTRODUCTION

1.1 Overview

- 1.1.1 This Notices for Non-Statutory & Statutory Publicity (Document Ref. 1.4) has been prepared on behalf of Net Zero Teesside Power Limited and Net Zero North Sea Storage Limited (the 'Applicants'). It forms part of the application (the 'Application') for a Development Consent Order (a 'DCO'), that has been submitted to the Secretary of State (the 'SoS') for Business, Energy and Industrial Strategy, under Section 37 of 'The Planning Act 2008' (the 'PA 2008').
- 1.1.2 The Applicants are seeking development consent for the construction, operation and maintenance of the Net Zero Teesside Project ('NZT'), including associated development (together the 'Proposed Development') on land at and in the vicinity of the former Redcar Steel Works site, Redcar and in Stockton-on-Tees, on Teesside (the 'Site'). The former Steel Works site, along with other land required for the Proposed Development, lies within the boundary of the land controlled by the South Tees Development Corporation ('STDC'), which is now known as 'Teesworks'.
- 1.1.3 A DCO is required for the Proposed Development as it falls within the definition and thresholds for a 'Nationally Significant Infrastructure Project' (a 'NSIP') under Sections 14(1)(a) and 15 of the PA 2008, associated development under Section 115(1)(b) and by direction under Sections 35(1) and 35ZA of the same Act. The DCO, if made by the SoS, would be known as the 'Net Zero Teesside Order' (the 'Order').
- 1.1.4 The Proposed Development will be the UK's first commercial scale, full chain Carbon Capture, Usage and Storage ('CCUS') project and will initially capture up to 4 million tonnes (Mt) of carbon dioxide (CO₂) emissions per annum. It will comprise a number of elements, including a new gas-fired electricity generating station with post-combustion carbon capture plant; gas, water and electricity connections (for the generating station); a CO₂ pipeline network (a 'gathering network') for collecting CO₂ from a cluster of local industries on Teesside; a CO₂ compressor station (for the compression of the CO₂) and a CO₂ export pipeline.
- 1.1.5 The CO₂ captured from the electricity generating station and local industries will be compressed and then transported (via the export pipeline) for secure storage within the Endurance saline aquifer located 145 kilometres offshore from Teesside under the North Sea. The export pipeline has the capacity to carry up to 10Mt of CO₂ per annum. The Proposed Development will therefore make a significant contribution toward the UK reaching its greenhouse gas emissions target by 2050.

1.2 The Applicants

- 1.2.1 NZT encompasses proposals to both decarbonise electricity generation and a cluster of carbon intensive industries on Teesside. In line with the CCUS business models published by BEIS in December 2020, there will be separate entities who will be responsible for:
 - electricity generation with post-combustion carbon capture (including the gas, water and electricity connections);



- CO₂ gathering (from industrial emitters), CO₂ compression and CO₂ transportation and storage; and
- industrial (including hydrogen production) carbon capture and connections to the CO₂ gathering network.
- 1.2.2 The entities are set out in **Table 1.2** below:

1.2.3 NZT is being promoted by Net Zero Teesside Power Limited ('NZT Power') and Net Zero North Sea Storage Limited ('NZNS Storage'). NZT Power and NZNS Storage




- (together the Applicants for the purposes of the DCO Application) have been incorporated on behalf of bp as operator of the two Partnerships.
- 1.2.4 The electricity generation with post-combustion carbon capture Partnership comprises bp, Eni, Equinor and Total, with bp leading as operator. NZT Power will be responsible for the Proposed Development in so far as it relates to the construction, operation and eventual decommissioning of the electricity generating station together with its carbon capture plant (both within the scope of the DCO Application).
- 1.2.5 The CO₂ gathering network, CO₂ compression and onshore section of CO₂ export pipeline Partnership comprises bp, Eni, Equinor, National Grid, Shell and Total, with bp leading as operator. NZNS Storage will be responsible for the Proposed Development in so far as it relates to the construction, operation and eventual decommissioning of the equipment required for the high-pressure compression of CO₂ from the electricity generating station and industrial emitters via the CO₂ gathering network and the onshore section of the CO₂ export pipeline (these are all within the scope of the DCO Application).
- 1.2.6 NZNS Storage will also be responsible for the offshore elements of NZT, comprising the offshore section of the CO₂ export pipeline (below Mean Low Water Springs ('MLWS')) to a suitable offshore geological CO₂ storage site under the North Sea, CO₂ injection wells and associated infrastructure. The offshore elements of NZT (with the exception of the gas and CO₂ pipeline crossings of the River Tees and the water outfall from the electricity generating station) do not form part of the DCO Application.

1.3 What is Carbon Capture, Usage and Storage?

1.3.1 Carbon Capture, Usage and Storage ('CCUS') is a process that removes CO₂ emissions at source, for example emissions from a power station or chemical manufacturing installation, and then compresses the CO₂ so that it can be safely transported to secure underground storage sites. It is then injected into layer of solid rock filled with interconnected pores where the CO₂ becomes trapped and locked in place, preventing it from being released into the atmosphere. **Figure 1.1** below shows what is involved in the process.



Figure 1.1: CCUS Process



- 1.3.2 The technologies used in CCUS are proven and have been used safely across the world for many years. Storage sites are located several kilometres underground and are subject to stringent tests to ensure that they are geologically suitable. In the UK, it is expected that the storage sites will be located offshore, in areas such as the North Sea.
- 1.3.3 CCUS is one of a number of technologies that are crucial to reducing CO_2 emissions and combatting global warming. The UK Government has committed to achieving net zero in terms of greenhouse gas emissions by 2050. This is a legally binding target.

1.4 The Site

- 1.4.1 The Site lies within the administrative boundaries of both Redcar and Cleveland Borough Council and Stockton-on-Tees Borough Council. It also partly lies within the boundary of the Teesworks area that is controlled by the STDC.
- 1.4.2 Most of the Site lies within the administrative area of Redcar and Cleveland Borough Council, although parts of Site (for the electricity generating station's gas supply connection to the National Transmission System for gas and the CO₂ gathering network) cross the River Tees into the administrative area of Stockton-on-Tees Borough Council. At this location the River Tees is tidal. In addition, there are elements of the Site which extend into South Gare, Coatham Sands and the North Sea. Those sections of the Site that are below MLWS are outside the jurisdiction of either local authority being part of the UK marine area.
- 1.4.3 The Site extends to approximately 462 hectares ('ha') in area. Much of it comprises previously developed (including part of the former Redcar Steel Works Site) and existing industrial land, some of which was reclaimed from the Tees Estuary in the late C19th and during the C20th. The Site is relatively flat and low-lying and sits at a level of between sea level and 9 metres Above Ordnance Datum ('AOD'). The area surrounding the Site is largely characterised by industrial and commercial uses, although there are open areas of land to the north in the form of South Gare and



- Coatham Sands, which are used for recreational purposes and that are of nature conservation importance.
- 1.4.4 A more detailed description of the Site and its surroundings is provided at Chapter 3 'Description of the Existing Environment' in the Environmental Statement ('ES') Volume I (Document Ref. 6.2).

1.5 The Proposed Development

- 1.5.1 The Proposed Development will work by capturing CO₂ from the electricity generating station in addition to a cluster of local industries on Teesside and transporting it via a CO₂ export pipeline to the Endurance saline aquifer under the North Sea. The Proposed Development will initially capture and transport up to 4Mt of CO₂ per annum, although the CO₂ export pipeline has the capacity to accommodate up to 10Mt of CO₂ per annum thereby allowing for future expansion.
- 1.5.2 The Proposed Development comprises the following elements:
 - a combined cycle gas turbine electricity generating station with an electrical output of between 750 and 860 megawatts and post-combustion carbon capture plant;
 - cooling water, gas and electricity grid connections and infrastructure for the generating station;
 - a CO₂ gathering network (including connections under the tidal River Tees) to collect and transport the captured CO₂ from industrial emitters to a CO₂ compressor station (the industrial emitters using the gathering network will be responsible for consenting their own carbon capture plant and connections to the gathering network);
 - a high-pressure CO₂ compressor station to receive and compress the captured CO₂ from the generating station and gathering network before it is transported offshore; and
 - a dense phase CO₂ export pipeline for the onward transport of the captured and compressed CO₂ to the Endurance saline aquifer under the North Sea.
- 1.5.3 The electricity generating station, its post-combustion carbon capture plant and the CO₂ compressor station will be located on part of the STDC Teesworks area (on part of the former Redcar Steel Works Site). The CO₂ export pipeline will also start in this location before heading offshore. The generating station connections and the CO₂ gathering network will require corridors of land within both Redcar and Stockton-on-Tees, including crossings beneath the River Tees.
- 1.5.4 All of the above elements are included in the scope of the DCO Application, with the exception of the CO₂ export pipeline, where only the onshore section of pipeline above MLWS is included. The CO₂ export pipeline below MLWS and the CO₂ storage site under the North Sea (the Endurance saline aquifer) will be the subject of separate consent applications, including under the Petroleum Act 1998 and the



Energy Act 2008. These applications will be supported by an Offshore Environmental Statement.

1.5.5 The ancillary development required in connection with and subsidiary to the above elements of the Proposed Development is detailed in Schedule 1 of the draft DCO (Document Ref. 2.1). A more detailed description of the Proposed Development is provided at Schedule 1 'Authorised Development' of the draft DCO and Chapter 4 'The Proposed Development' in ES Volume I (Document Ref. 6.2) and the areas within which each of the main elements of the Proposed Development are to be built are denoted by the coloured and hatched areas on the Works Plans (Document Ref. 4.4).

1.6 The Purpose and Structure of this Document

- 1.6.1 The purpose of this document is to list and provide copies of the notices that have been published in national and local newspapers and other relevant publications, erected in the vicinity of the Site and sent to prescribed persons, where relevant, during the Applicants' pre-application consultation on the Proposed Development. This included the Applicants' Stage 1 Consultation (October to November 2019), Stage 2 Consultation (July to September 2020), Section 42 Update Consultation (December 2020 to January 2021) and Community Update (January to February 2021).
- 1.6.2 The Applicants' Stage 2 Consultation and Section 42 Update Consultation where statutory consultation and the notices published and erected were done so in order to comply with the statutory publicity requirements of the PA 2008, 'The Infrastructure Planning (Applications: Prescribed Forms and Procedure) Regulations 2009' (the 'APFP Regulations') and 'The Infrastructure Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations 2017' (the 'EIA Regulations')
- 1.6.3 For more detail on the Applicants' pre-application consultation reference should be made to the Consultation Report (Document Ref. 5.1).
- 1.6.4 The notices published for the Stage 1 Consultation are listed in Table 2.1 within Section 2. Those for the Stage 2 Consultation, the newspaper notices published and site notices erected, are listed in Table 3.1 within Section 3 with those for the Section 42 Update Consultation and the Community Update listed in Table 4.1 within Section 4.



2.0 NOTICES FOR STAGE 1 CONSULTATION

- 2.1.1 The notices published for the Stage 1 Consultation, which was non-statutory consultation, are listed in **Table 2.1** below.
- 2.1.2 The Stage 1 Consultation was undertaken by the Oil and Gas Climate Initiative ('OGCI'), a voluntary initiative comprising a number of companies from the oil and gas sector, including bp, ENI, Equinor, Shell and Total. At that time, the OGCI was responsible for taking forward the CCUS proposals. The Proposed Development was also known as the Teesside Cluster CCUS Project. The notices therefore refer to OCGI and the Teesside Cluster CCUS Project.

3.0 NOTICES FOR STAGE 2 CONSULTATION

- 3.1.1 The notices published for the Stage 2 Consultation, which was statutory consultation, are listed in **Table 3.1** below.
- 3.1.2 As confirmed in Section 2, the Stage 1 Consultation was undertaken by the OGCI and at that time the Proposed Development was known as the Teesside Cluster CCUS Project.
- 3.1.3 NZT Power and NZNS Storage (the Applicants for the purposes of the DCO Application) were subsequently incorporated on 20 February 2020 on behalf of OGCI to take forward the proposals for a CCUS project on Teesside, including the DCO Application. In early 2020, the Proposed Development was also rebranded as the Net Zero Teesside Project. These changes took place in advance of the Stage 2 Consultation. The Stage 2 Consultation, and all subsequent consultation activity, engagement and publicity on the Proposed Development, has been undertaken by NZT Power and NZNS Storage, as the Applicants, and under the name of Net Zero Teesside.



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

scheme.

UWRA's scheme proposes the reinstatement of the six-mile Garsdale to Hawes branch of the Settle to Carlisle main line, provision of a new railway service to Hawes in Upper Wensleydale, by extending the present Manchester – Black-burn – Clitheroe service to Settle, the Yorkshire Three Peaks area and on to Hawes. The scheme has been backed MP and Chancellor Rishi Sunak

UWRA was formed following a public meeting in 2018. Chairman Andrew Longworth said: "The scheme is intended to provide wide ranging socio-economic benefits for

the communities of Upper Wensleydale and to provide new, convenient journey opportunities across the

region."
Originally opened in October 1878, Hawes to Garsdale was the only branch line of the Midland Railway on the Settle and Carlisle. At Hawes, it formed an end-on junction with the North Eastern Railway's branch line from Northallerton, providing a connection between the east and west coast lines.

Scheduled passenger services ceased in 1959, resuming for a few days in the severe winter of 1962/63, when snow made local roads impassable. The line finally closed in April 1964 and was subsequently dismantled.

All 50 proposals to re-connect communities will now be considered by an expert panel including Network Rail chairman Sir Peter Hendv. with announcements regarding the successful schemes expected by the end of the summer.

Concern at plans for 24/7 opening of rebuilt garage

A NATIONAL fuel retailer is facing calls to transform its plans to replace a service station that was destroyed in a fire amid claims its proposal would impact on residents' quality of life and the Georgian conservation area surrounding it.

Following widespread concerns being raised over Harvest Energy's planning application for a significantly larger fuel station and a 24hour convenience store at its site in Victoria Road, Richmond, planners look set to ask the firm if it would consider compromises to its propos-

Ahead of the controversial proposals being considered by Richmondshire District Council's planning committee, the firm could also have to undertake a noise impact assessment.

However, many residents say they are keen to have a petrol station at the site, which has been levelled since an electrical fault sparked a fire of such gravity last August that 50 firefighters were called in to tackle it. With only one other small petrol station in the town, councillors say many trips are being made to fill up vehicles out of town, which is bad for Richmond's economy. In addition, Richmond councillors have concluded as there is a clear need to replace the petrol station and an absence of obvious alternative sites, the filling station should remain on the site, which is an unusual one for a service station in North Yorkshire given the properties surrounding it.

Planning documents submitted to the council state while a proposed 24-hour shop would create the equivalent of five full-time jobs



at the site, the petrol station should be larger and incorporate parking spaces for the shop.

An environmental health officer has highlighted the shop and petrol station did not previously operate at night-time and the plan for 24-hour seven-day opening of both the shop and petrol station had "potential to have some adverse impact on nearby residential properties during the night in terms of noise associated with use of the facilities and also operation of the servicing activities". The officer wrote: "At this stage no information has been submitted to demonstrate that these activities will have a low impact on nearby residential properties."



THE A66 TRUNK ROAD (SCOTCH CORNER INTERCHANGE TO BOWES INTERCHANGE) (TEMPORARY RESTRICTION AND PROHIBITION OF TRAFFIC)

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that Highways England Company Limited intends to make an Order on the A66 Trunk Road, in the Counties of North Yorkshire and County Durham, to enable stud installation works to be carried out in safety.

The works are expected to start on Sunday 14 February 2021 for 16 weeks, or until completed.

The effect of the Order will be, between

- 8pm and 6am, to:
 (i) close the A66 eastbound carriageway from 145 metres west of Rokeby Junction to Lanehead Lane, a distance of 4480 metre during which times traffic will be diverted onto the opposite carriageway using a contraflor system and controlled by traffic lights;
- close the A66 westbound carriageway from Lanehead Lane to 145 metres wes of Rokeby Junction, a distance of 4480 metres; during which times traffic will be diverted onto the opposite carriageway using a contraflow system and controlled
- by traffic lights;
 (iii) close the A66 eastbound entry and exit slip roads at Rokeby Junction:
- ban vehicles from entering or leaving the A66 at its junction with the south side of Rokeby Junction leading to Greta Bridge Bank; and
- close the bus stop areas adjacent to the A66 eastbound carriageway approximately 160 metres east of Rokeby Junction and westbound carriageway approximately 330 metres east of Rokeby junction.

It will be necessary, for 24 hours a day, for the duration of the works, to impose a temporary 50mph, 40mph, 30mph and at times a 10mph speed restriction on:

- (vi) the A66 carriageway from 2110 metres west of Rokeby Junction to 145 metres west of Rokeby Junction, a distance of 1965 metres: and
- (vii) the above lengths of carriageway as described in (i) and (ii).

The 10mph speed restriction will only apply when, for safety reasons, traffic has to be escorted through the works by a highway maintenance vehicle.

Traffic management will be in force 24 hours a day and traffic signs will indicate the extent of the restrictions (which will not apply to emergency service vehicles or special forces vehicles) and prohibitions (which will not apply to emergency service vehicles or vehicles being used in connection with the said works or for winter maintenance or traffic officer purposes). The Order comes into force on 13 February 2021 and has a maximum duration of eighteen months.
